Description

The *Child Temperament Self-Report* was developed by Gallagher (1999) to tap the child's perceptions of his/her own temperament, based on items found on the *Children's Behavior Questionnaire*. The items measure five conceptual temperamental characteristics: anger/frustration, shyness, inhibitory control, activity level, and high intensity pleasure. Items are rated on a 4-point scale ranging from 1 = not at all to 4 = a lot.

Administration: Grade 1

This measure was administered to <u>children</u> (n = 101) during a site-specific home visit at the end of Grade 1.

Scoring

Scores have not been computed for this measure.
