## **Description**

Feelings about School is a 24-item measure of positive and negative affect regarding school. It was developed by Essex (1997) based on the *Positive and Negative Affect Schedule* (Watson et al., 1988) as a questionnaire for administration to mothers, to tap children's affective states about school. Each item is rated on a 4-point scale ranging from 1 = not at all to 4 = a lot to indicate the extent to which the child expresses the indicated affect. Wulfsohn (2000) modified the measure further for telephone administration to mothers, and for administration to children.

### **Administration: Grade 1**

This measure was administered as an interview to mothers near the beginning (n = 93) and end (n = 96) of Grade 1 by telephone, and to children (n = 101) during a site-specific home visit at the end of Grade 1, for Samantha Wulfsohn's dissertation research.

### Scoring: Wulfsohn (2000)

Note that there are items on all versions of *Feelings about School* that Wulfsohn did not score. Items 2, 3, & 5 on the parent report at the beginning of the year are data-entered as *not at all* = 1,  $a \ little = 2$ , somewhat = 3,  $quite \ a \ bit = 4$ . Items 1 & 4 are entered as they appear on the form.

### Positive Feelings about School

A higher score indicates more positive affect about school.

A higher score indicates more negative affect about school.
